Report on Impact of the 2016 Kumamoto Earthquake (Fourth Update)

HORIBA, Ltd. deeply mourns the loss of life, injuries and loss of property caused by the series of earthquakes that have struck Kumamoto Prefecture and the surrounding regions since April 14. We likewise extend our most profound condolences to all those affected by the impact of this grave natural disaster.

We provide the following update on the status of HORIBA Group operations in the impacted area. This includes the Aso Factory of HORIBA STEC Co., Ltd. and the service station of HORIBA Techno Service Co., Ltd., both of which are located in the Nishihara-mura(Village) of Kumamoto Prefecture.

1. Earthquake Damage and Current Conditions

(1) Human Casualties

There have been no reports of deaths or injuries to any HORIBA Group employees as a result of the earthquakes.

(2) Status of Production Bases, Other Facilities

<Factory Damage>

With regard to the factory, although damage occurred in the high-voltage power receiving facilities, that reception has been restored through an alternative method. Efforts continue to investigate and confirm damage occurring in other facilities as well, to be followed by appropriate steps needed to resume normal operations.

<Factory Operation>

For the blood testing equipment and reagents of the Medical-Diagnostic Instruments & Systems, partial resumption of production operations was achieved on April 25th. Regarding mass flow controllers and other products of the Semiconductor Instruments & Systems, the

plan calls for steady resumption of production operations in stages from April 26th.

<HORIBA Product Supplies>

For the blood testing equipment and reagents, prospects have been firmed up for continuing supply operations without any delays, based upon domestic inventory and procurement from Group overseas companies.

For mass flow controllers and other products, moves will be stepped up to resume production at the Aso Factory, shift output to the Kyoto head office and adopt other measures.

2. Impact on Performance

The details of the impact of these earthquakes on the business performance of the HORIBA Group remain under investigation. Rest assured that prompt updates will be provided upon identification of any serious situations in that regard from here on.
